Costs for students during the first summer of enrollment, including travel, stipend and health insurance are paid centrally by the program until October 1st.

Costs for MSTP-funded M.D./Ph.D. students during the medical school phase of training are paid by extramural funds and are not charged to the mentor or intramural program.

Mentors of students holding Rhodes, Gates or Marshall scholarships DO NOT pay the stipend, insurance or tuition costs during the first two years of training and pay lower central training costs to the IC. Churchill and Fulbright fellowships cover Year 1 costs.

¹Standard Pre-Doc IRTA stipend. Levels may vary depending on a student's years of post-baccalaureate research experience prior to joining the program. Complete information is available at <http://www.training.nih.gov/stipends.asp>. Stipend and medical insurance payments for students are administered through the IRTA mechanism and stipends are deposited directly into students' bank accounts. For IRTA support, students must be in residence at the NIH for at least 51% of their total research training time.

² FAES health insurance usually paid by institute. Even when students are in the UK, FAES health insurance is provided.

³ Tuition and College Fees are paid centrally by the program through collections from the IC Scientific Directors.

⁴ Travel amounts are recommended based on necessary U.S.-U.K. travel including travel to the annual Student Colloquium in addition to one conference per year.

The student's sponsoring IC will receive an Interagency Agreement each year, based on the average number of students in the IC in the previous 4 years, to cover the first and second year tuition and college fee costs. The financial calculations of central funding of students' costs are approved by the Scientific Directors each year.
